

Tri-Township Park District

The regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Tri-Township Park District was held on Monday Evening, April 28, 1969, at the Troy City Council Room.

Commissioners present were Russell Wiesemeyer, Oscar Lindler, Milton Langenwalter, George Schmalz, and J. W. Dull.

Others present: None.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P.M. by president Russell Wiesemeyer.

The minutes of the previous meeting of March 24, 1969, were read and approved as read.

 ② a letter from Wm. S. Rutherford was read stating that the Governor had approved the warrant for our matching fund. It was moved by Oscar Lindler and seconded by George Schmalz that the communications be accepted and placed on file. The motion carried.

The Treasurer's report for April 28, 1969 was read. It was moved by George Schmalz and seconded by Oscar Lindler that the Treasurer's report be accepted as read. The motion carried.

Russell Wiesemeyer reported that he, and J. W. Dull had canvassed the election results on April 16, 1969, and found the following results.

It was moved by Oscar Gindler and seconded by George Schmalz that the communications be accepted. The motion carried.

It was moved by Oscar Gindler and seconded by George Schmalz that the appointment of these persons as election judges be approved. The motion carried.

A general discussion followed concerning methods to be used to get some action. A letter was prepared and signed by the Commissioners to be sent to Ralph T. Smith on Thursday, March 27. Mr Paul Riebold will send a follow up letter the following Thursday. Russell Wiesemeyer reported that he had discussed the matter with Ted Mikessell, and also that Wendell Durr had telephoned the Governor's office, and had been promised that the matter would be looked into.

There being no further business appearing it was moved by Oscar Gindler, seconded by Milton Langenwarter and carried that the meeting be adjourned.

President Wiesemeyer declared the meeting adjourned at 9:00 P.M.
