There was considerable discussion in regards to other regulations which would prevent us from giving any permission for children to use mini-bikes in the Park. Milton Langenwalter is going to try to find out what he can about this.

It was moved by Oscar Lindler, and seconded by George Schmalz that the meeting be adjourned. The motion carried and President Wiesemeyer declared the meeting adjourned at 9:50 P.M.
